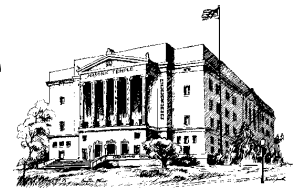

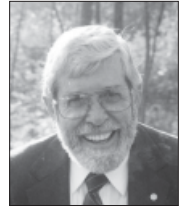

HISTORICAL LECTURE

September 30, 1910 – In the minutes of this date we read, "At the conclusion of the feast, Sir Knight Wm. B. Sullivan, P.C., in a reminiscent address and on behalf of the generous donor Sir Knight John W. Durst, presented to the Commandery a magnificent bronze tablet containing the historical data of all Past Commanders of Reed Commandery. The Commander, Em. Sir Joseph Wortman, on behalf of Reed Commandery most appropriately accepted the gift and heartily thanked S.K. Durst for his more than generous remembrance. At the presentation, Right Em. Sir Knights Eli Fasold, M.J. Houck and W.L. Bates each entertained all present with pleasant views of the past history and pilgrimages of the Commander and at a reasonable hour one of the most pleasant and never-to-be-forgotten events in the history of Reed was brought to a successful termination". (It was the good fortune of those present that evening to witness something that had never before happened in Reed Commandery and probably will never happen again. It was that three of the four speakers of the evening were Past Grand Commanders of Ohio, all Past Commanders of Reed, representing over 30 years of the Grand Commandery. The fourth speaker, the Em. Commander Joseph Wortman was also to have the honor bestowed upon him a few years later.)

THE MARSHAL

The Marshal was the chief Templar military officer responsible for the individual commanders and the horses, arms, equipment, and anything else involving military operations, a key responsibility. He also had the authority in obtaining, ordering, and distributing supplies, critically important at the time of the Crusades. His office was an important one, as no Templar charge in battle was undertaken without his orders, and he also had the distinct honor of carrying the Templar's famed black-and-white standard, the beauseant, in battle. Taking it from the Under-marshal, he would then appoint a special sub-unit of ten knights, under their own commander, to protect him in battle. Sometimes, there was also a Gonfanier (banner bearer), who would carry the standard in battle, under the Marshal's specific direction.

The “Three to One” Challenge

Your year-end gift means the Dayton Masonic Foundation will receive three more dollars from the Schiewetz Foundation for every dollar you contribute. Now is the time to consider year-end planning to coordinate your tax and gift planning. Those of us who want to make a difference for future generations should consider how we can increase the impact of our giving. A gift completed by Dec. 31st can reduce one’s tax bill for the current year while multiplying the benefit to the Dayton Masonic Foundation with the “Three to One” Schiewetz Foundation challenge. We may never get this opportunity again.

Here are some important ideas that may be helpful with your year-end gift planning:

Cash Gifts and Tax Savings

Cash is still the most popular – and simplest – kind of charitable gift.

If you itemize your deductions, your cash gift is deductible in the year of the gift up to 50% of your adjusted gross income. Your actual tax savings depends upon the amount of your gift as well as your income tax bracket.

Example: John makes a \$5,000 charitable gift. He is in a 35% tax bracket. His tax savings will be \$1,750 (amount of gift multiplied by tax bracket). The after-tax cost of his \$5,000 gift is only \$3,250.

More Savings with Gifts of Appreciated Property

Did you know that you can give shares of that stock or mutual fund to the Dayton Masonic Foundation and enjoy greater tax savings than with a comparable cash gift? The reason: you receive an income tax charitable deduction for the full fair market value of the shares (assuming you have held them for more than one year) up to 30% of your adjusted gross income (AGI). You also MAY avoid any capital gains tax on the appreciation, even though this built-in gain has never been taxed. By using the untaxed gain to generate tax deductions, you substantially reduce the tax on your reportable income.

Example: Robert gives the Foundation shares of long-term appreciated stock valued at \$5,000. His cost basis is \$1,000. If he sold the stock he would incur a capital gains tax of \$600 on the \$4,000 gain (\$4,000 x 15% capital gains rate). By giving the stock to us he receives a deduction for the full fair market value of the stock (\$5,000). In his 35% tax bracket he saves \$1,750 and avoids the \$600 capital gains tax liability. The net cost of his gift is only \$2,650 (\$5,000 – \$1,750 – \$600) compared to \$3,250 for a cash gift of \$5,000.

Because the tax law provides special incentives to encourage gifts of long-term appreciated property, you actually can have a greater impact with your giving at a lesser cost. **Note: You should seek your tax advisor’s advice when planning your gift strategy.** Your generosity is truly appreciated and will allow us to air condition the Dayton Masonic Center assuring its relevance in Dayton for future generations of Masons and our community users.

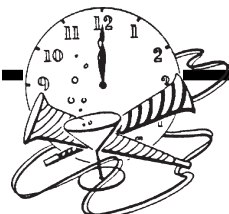
